Continuing Education Seminars

(you need 1 course to meet annual requirement)

Minnesota Gambling Control Board

ALLOWABLE EXPENSES (2) - Keep up-to-date on how you can spend your lawful gambling money for allowable expenses, why it is important to maintain the expense calculation form, and when reimbursement for negative balances is required. Also included is information on legislative changes that became effective this year regarding compensation (method of payment, lessor restrictions) and electronic transfers.

BINGO! (2) - The Board's bingo specialists will provide an overview of common problems and provide tips on how to prevent losses, such as checking inventory against daily sales, using the updated bingo inventory forms. Also discussed will be linked bingo-authorized by the Legislature, with rules being developed by the Gambling Control Board.

BOARD PROPERTY REQUESTS (1) - This class outlines what kind of real property requests the Board typically considers, such as repair and maintenance, acquisition of capital assets, eminent domain, and disasters. Learn what your organization can do under this lawful purpose category. If your organization owns its building, had damage to your building, is considering repairs to a building, erecting a veterans memorial, improving ball fields, or purchasing capital assets such as a trail groomer or medical supply equipment, attend this class to learn about Board requirements.

COMMON PROBLEMS IN COMPLIANCE REVIEWS (2) - Board staff discuss the common problems they have observed during compliance reviews. Learn how to easily prevent these problems with proper CEO and membership involvement and good internal controls. This class is for everyone -- whether you are the CEO, gambling manager, employee, or organization member. Also included is an overview of what to expect during a site inspection or investigation.

CONDUCT OF PULL-TABS (2) - An update on the conduct of pull-tabs will include information on the proper way to put a game into play, mix tickets, who can play and when, completing prize receipts, winner ID requirements, and what to expect during a site inspection or investigation.

GAMBLING FRAUD & ILLEGAL GAMBLING (2) - A popular class conducted by investigators from the Gambling Control Board and the Alcohol and Gambling Enforcement Division (Department of Public Safety) will provide firsthand knowledge of

their recent experiences in investigating lawful gambling fraud. Learn the type of cases they are finding and how you can prevent your organization from being the next victim. Also included is information on illegal gambling, card tournaments, and sports bookmaking.

GCB WEB SITE & LAWFUL GAMBLING MANUAL (1) - The Gambling Control Board's web master will be conducting an overview of the Board's web site and the newly revised Lawful Gambling Manual. Learn how to locate forms, contact Board staff, check the education schedule, and more through the web site. You'll learn how to obtain up-to-date information for forms, Gaming News, continuing education classes, publications, and more.

LAWFUL PURPOSE EXPENDITURES (3) - Keep up-to-date on how you can spend your lawful gambling money for lawful purpose expenditures. Also included is information on legislative changes that became effective this year ... recognizing military service, utilities and membership events for veteran's organizations, and payment of certain fees.

NEW LEGISLATION & RULES UPDATE (3) -

The Executive Director of the Gambling Control Board will provide his insight on the legislative changes that occurred in the 2003 legislative session, including changes to license fees, gambling manager membership requirements and continuing education, rent reform, lawful purpose expenditures, and allowable expenses. Also included is an overview of proposed legislative and rule changes for the future.

RAFFLES, TIPBOARDS, AND PADDLEWHEELS

[MEAT RAFFLES] (1) - Did you know that all unsold raffle tickets must be kept with your records; otherwise you'll pay a gambling tax on the missing tickets? Learn how to correctly use merchandise certificates in your raffles, and what records must be maintained for a raffle, including a ticket log and keeping all unsold tickets. The conduct of meat raffles and how to use the required merchandise prize inventory forms is included. We'll also provide an overview of progressive tipboards ... the newest game in town when the Board's rules are finalized.

REAL STORIES FROM THE CRG BLOTTER [OR, LEARNING FROM MISTAKES OF OTHERS] (2) -

We're bringing back one of our most popular classes from last year. Hear real life stories from the Board's Compliance Officer who will discuss actual CRG case files, including illegal gambling (football boards), rent abuse, and embezzlement. An informative class that will help you gain insight on how to avoid penalties, fines, and license revocation. A don't miss class.

RENT, LEASES, & LICENSING CHANGES (3) -

In this new class, the Board's Licensing Supervisor will provide you with information on the legislative changes that occurred this year regarding rent reform, how to complete the new lease form, handling cash shortages, compensation, and licensing changes

SECURITY & FUND LOSSES (2) -

Taught by the Board's investigative team, this class is based on real life examples showing how the lack of adequate security and good internal controls resulted in fund losses for organizations. An investigator from the city of St. Paul will also provide firsthand information on recent burglaries and the basic steps you can take for security.

WHO'S ON FIRST? WHAT A CEO NEEDS TO KNOW (1) -

Are you a recently-elected president, director, or commander? The Executive Director of the Gambling Control Board will provide his observations on the CEO's legal responsibility to provide leadership and oversight for an organization. A summary of case studies of how organizations have lost their licenses without CEO oversight will be included. .

MINI 30 PADDLEWHEEL [MEAT RAFFLE] (1) - Learn how to report the play of the Mini 30 paddlewheel (meat raffle) when either cash or merchandise is awarded. How to report an “in play” paddlewheel game at the end of the month on the Schedule F.

SCHEDULE F & PROFIT CARRYOVER VARIANCES (1) - How to complete the Schedule F. Will discuss remedies for profit carryover variances and possible ramifications of not balancing.

SITE PROFITABILITY (1) - Learn how to determine if a site is profitable or not after taking into consideration the organization’s total tax liability.

Internal Revenue Service

NEW GAMBLING MANAGERS (2) Feeling dumb as a rock? Join us other rocks in a discussion about being a new Gambling Manager and what it means to be in charge. Discussion items? Communicating: with employees, CEO, vendors, bar owners, membership, and the GCB. Making money: ordering games, pulling games, point of sale and bottom line.
