Gambling Manager ALERT

At the GCB monthly board meeting on Monday, October 18, 2010 Director Tom Barrett announced that over 800 gambling managers have not yet attended a continuing education class for 2010. Remember gambling managers are required to attend at least one continuing education class each CALENDAR YEAR. Please note there will be 22 classes (13 topics) offered at The 20th Annual Minnesota Lawful Gambling

Convention & Expo being held November 18-19-20, 2010 at the Mayo Civic Center in Rochester, MN (see pages 4, 5, 7, 8, & 9 for Seminar & Workshop details). *If you are planning to meet your continuing education training requirement for calendar year 2010 at the Convention & Expo it is important to check Gambling Manager on the 2010 Attendee Official Registration Form (see yellow insert).*

Proposed ACM 2011 Legislative Platform

Printed below are the legislative proposals the ACM Board Of Directors will be presenting at the 2010 Allied Charities Of Minnesota Annual Meeting (see page 10). *This will likely be the most important ACM Annual Meeting ever and we hope you will attend.*

Effective July 1, 2011

- Allow for Electronic Linked Bingo (*handheld devices*)
- Shift Pull-Tab & Tipboard Tax from being paid up front to distributor to being paid monthly after a game is closed

Effective July 1, 2012

- Allow for Electronic Pull-Tabs (*handheld devices*)
- Change Lawful Gambling Tax rate from 8.5% to 5%, change Pull-Tab & Tipboard Tax rate from 1.7% to 1%, change Combined Receipts Tax rates from 1.7%, 3.4%, 5.1% to 1%, 2%, & 3% and brackets to \$600,000-\$800,000, \$800,000-\$1,000,000, & \$1,000,000+, change Combined Receipts Tax to individual site-by-site basis

The Proposed ACM 2011 Legislative Platform will be discussed at the ACM Regional Meetings at the ACM Convention & Expo on Friday morning November 19, 2010 prior to the 2010 ACM Annual Meeting.

Proposed 2010 Seminar & Workshop Topics

Continuing Education Seminars

(you now need only 1 course to meet annual requirement)

Minnesota Gambling Control Board

ARE YOU SMARTER THAN A GCB COMPLIANCE SPECIALIST? (UPDATES, ISSUES, AND COMMON PROBLEMS) (3) - This class is geared towards active gambling managers or those with considerable experience overseeing a lawful gambling operation. Compliance staff from the Gambling Control Board will provide up-to-date information on current issues and compliance problems that they see in their daily work. Included will be information on sanctions for late filing of returns, prize receipt label problems, local authority and updating information under the perpetual licensing system, 501c3's that transfer money to their general account, inventory reporting errors, information on acceptable bingo game variations, a review of industry-wide trends in receipts and expenditures, and other topics.

BAR BINGO - IT AIN'T JUST A PASSING FAD... (2) - Bar bingo continues to grow in popularity. This is a "how to" class for organizations considering bar bingo or who are currently conducting it and would like a refresher. The class covers what you need to know to get started - equipment required, programs, calling numbers, prizes, inventory, reporting, staffing, etc. Also included is information on how you can legally seek advertising income for your bingo program to increase your profits.

BET THE "HOUSE" - FOR ORGANIZATIONS THAT OWN THEIR BUILDING (1) - This class addresses the expenditure and other issues that are unique to veteran and fraternal organizations. Find out the guidelines for property taxes, building repair and maintenance, leasing out space in your building, and

so on. The class includes information regarding the 2010 statute change regarding utility payments.

"CHARITABLE GAMBLING IN MN" - TIME FOR CHANGE? (1) - It has been 25 years since charitable gaming was put under the regulatory umbrella with the State of Minnesota. For the most part, there has been little change to the format for charitable gambling but a lot of other things have changed. The Director of the Gambling Control Board will provide some insight on industry trends from the past and take a peek at what things could be in the future. Bring an open mind and find a comfortable chair - the future of charitable gaming is the agenda...

COW POOP... AND OTHER SUCCESSFUL RAFFLE CHANGES (1) - This class explains how to conduct a successful raffle, and how you can legally seek advertising income as part of a raffle to increase your profits. Also included will be information on conducting the more popular alternative forms of raffles, such as calendar raffles, button raffles, "cow bingo," and duck race raffles. Frequently asked questions will also be addressed.

DO'S AND DON'TS - HOW TO SPEND YOUR GAMBLING FUNDS WISELY (2) - This is a general overview class intended for organization members and for those wanting a little refresher of the basics. Allowable expenses and lawful purpose expenditures will be covered along with some of the more common "illegal" expenditures that organizations sometimes make with their lawful gambling proceeds.

FRAUD AND ILLEGAL GAMBLING - LEARN FROM MISTAKES OF OTHERS (2) - You'll hear firsthand knowledge of recent experiences in investigating lawful gambling fraud from the Alcohol and Gambling Enforcement Division (Department of Public Safety) and from a Board investigator. Learn the type of cases that have been discovered and how you can prevent your organization from being the next victim. Also included is information on illegal gambling, card tournaments, sports bookmaking, and Texas Hold'em tournaments.

INTERNAL CONTROL – HOW TO STAY OUT OF TROUBLE (OR PAY THE PRICE) (2)

- Learn how to prevent theft and embezzlement by implementing good internal controls. This class is geared for Gambling Managers, CEO's and members of gambling oversight committees. The class covers internal control guidelines, your organization's responsibilities, and an in-depth look at how poor internal controls could affect your organization. There will be examples of how to compare physical and perpetual inventories, how to spot audit games, how to involve your members, and more.

Minnesota Department Of Revenue **Lawful Gambling Tax Unit**

CERTIFIED INVENTORY AND CASH COUNT, ANNUAL AUDIT REQUIREMENTS (1) -

Discussion of the forms G1INV *Annual Certified Physical Inventory by Site*, G1CC *Annual Certified Cash Count for Games-in-play by Site*, G1CI *Annual Certified Physical Inventory and Cash Count Summary* and the annual audit requirements.

SITE PROFITABILITY (2) - Discussion on how to determine a site's profitability after paying taxes and prizes.

UNRELATED BUSINESS INCOME TAX UPDATES (1) - Discussion of the filing requirements and the updated M4NPS's, schedules and instructions.

Internal Revenue Service

501(C)(3) ISSUES (2) - This workshop covers recent developments and issues pertaining to 501(c)(3) charitable gambling organizations. Presenters will give direct feedback on areas of concern from a field agent's standpoint. The session will include the changes made to the Form 990 and filing requirements. A portion of the class will be devoted to answering questions from those attending the session.

NON 501(C)(3) ISSUES (2) - This workshop covers recent developments and issues pertaining to non 501(c)(3) charitable gambling organizations. Presenters will give direct feedback on areas of concern from a field agent's standpoint. The session will include the changes made to the Form 990 and filing requirements. A portion of the class will be devoted to answering questions from those attending the session.

Industry Seminars (IS)

CEO'S & OFFICERS (1) - A seminar for CEO's & Officers of licensed charitable gambling organizations. Items for discussion include: internal controls, CEO responsibility, membership duties, lawful purpose expenditures, getting involved with your gaming operation, legislative issues, Allied Charities membership (what it means), employee issues, changing CEO's and how it effects your gaming operation.

CREATING WOW (2) - Many hospitality and gaming providers talk about the power of treating gaming guests in such a way as to have them saying "WOW, how great was that." But can charitable gaming operators create WOW moments in their bingo, party and special event games and operations. Come find out as Steve Browne from Raving Consulting Company explains in detail the ten rules for creating WOW Moments in a gaming and hospitality environment. You just may find that you can create some WOW moments for your charitable gamers and have them coming back for more (and telling others too)!

ELECTRONIC LINKED BINGO/ELECTRONIC PULL-TABS - ADDING TO YOUR BOTTOM LINE (2) - See an electronic linked bingo and electronic pull-tab demonstration and find out how they can revitalize our industry and help reform and reduce charitable gambling taxes in the process! ACM representatives will wrap-up by discussing how to work with your elected officials to garner support for electronic linked bingo/electronic pull-tabs and charitable gambling tax reform and relief in the 2011 Legislative Session. ***If you are interested in charitable gambling tax reform and relief you will want to attend one of these sessions!***

MONTHLY TAX RETURNS FOR LAWFUL GAMBLING: THE G-1 AND SUPPORTING FORMS EXPLAINED AND COMPLETED (1) - You will actually fill out a Lawful Gambling Tax Return during this seminar. Each attendee will complete a “practice set” consisting of a G-1 and supporting schedules. The source documents will be provided and instructors will explain and assist on how the tax return is completed accurately and efficiently. Law changes, forms changes, internal control issues, proper documentation, and tips on how to find and correct errors will be discussed during the process of completing a monthly tax return. The goal is to provide Gambling Managers, CEOs, Board Members, and other gambling industry employees a much better understanding of the entire process and emphasize the positives of doing a complete, timely, and accurate job, each and every month.

SELLING THE GAME: USING SERVICE SKILLS TO SELL MORE OF YOUR PRODUCT (1) - What do you sell in your charitable gaming operation? Pull tabs across a counter? Bingo games in a hall or community center? Raffle tickets? Charitable games? Whatever your gaming product, the simple truth is the more you sell the more you make. And while service is good for making folks happy, its real power is in helping you to sell more of what you sell. In this session Steve Browne from Raving Consulting will lead you through a primer on how to use your service skills to create and execute powerful selling strategies in your charitable gaming operation. Come find out why it is “oh so true” that people simply will not buy something from people they don’t like (and trust).

STORIES OF LIFE: REKINDLING YOUR PASSION EVERYDAY (1) - Rekindle the passion you have for your work, your life, and yes, your desire to strive for excellence in everything you do. Where do you go to find (or rediscover) the passion inside of you? Well, come listen and see if our speaker, Steve Browne, is right when he says that your passion exists in the very stories that make up the fabric of your life.

Group Discussions

(Please note group discussions are intended to be open discussions by those attending on issues relating to the topic, not a lecture or seminar by the moderator(s). The moderator(s) will have a number of possible items to discuss to keep things moving along.)

NON-BOOTH SALES [BAR OPS] (1) - An open discussion by and for licensed charitable gambling organizations on issues relating to sites where the lessor and/or lessors employees make sales on behalf of the organization.

PULL-TAB CASHIERS & SELLERS (1) - An open discussion by and for licensed charitable gambling organizations on issues relating to pull-tab cashiers & sellers.

PULL-TAB DISPENSING DEVICES (1) - An open discussion by and for licensed charitable gambling organizations on issues relating to pull-tab dispensing devices.

VETERANS & FRATERNAL ORGANIZATIONS (2) - An open discussion by and for licensed charitable gambling organizations on issues relating to veterans or fraternal clubs.

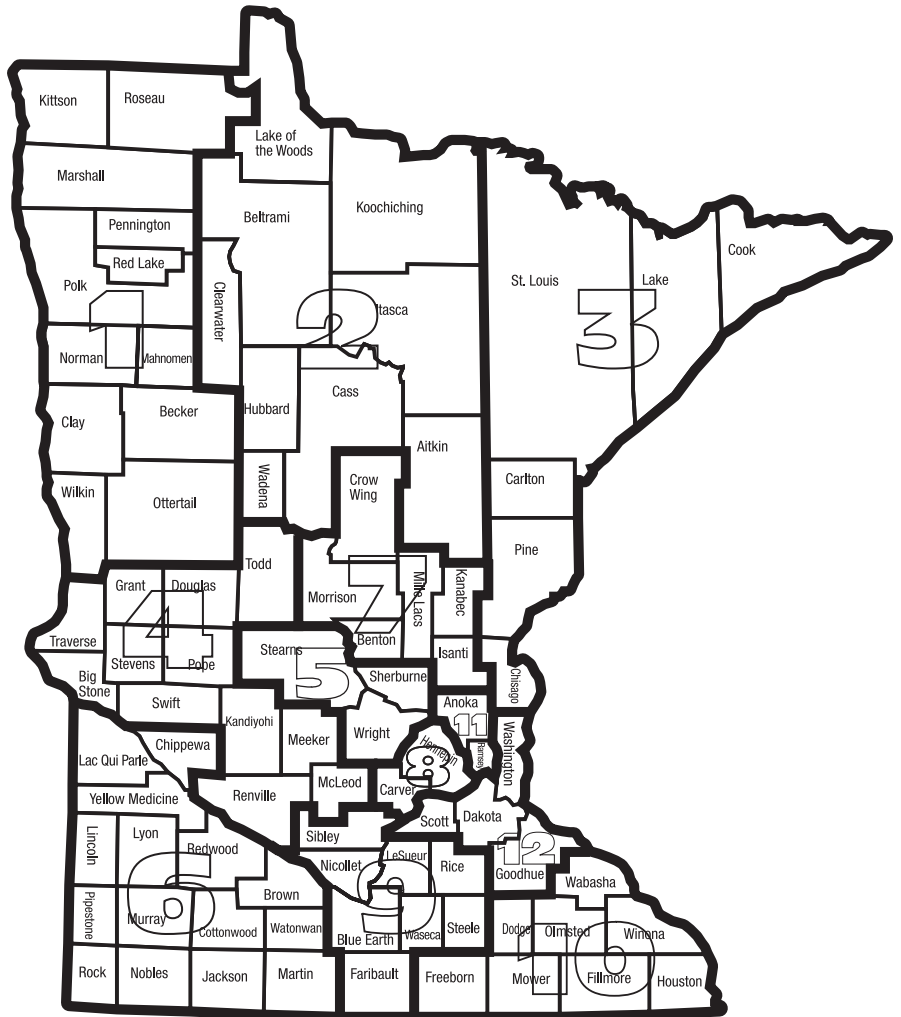
